

COPYRIGHT PERMISSION FOR ELECTRONIC RESERVES

Following section 107 of the Copyright Act of 1976, fair use guidelines allow materials to be made available for one semester without copyright permission. Materials used again for subsequent offerings of a course or for different courses taught by the same instructor are expected to have copyright release from the copyright holder. Memorial Library requests copyright and pays the royalties (please see electronic reserve copyright fee limits below) required for copyright permission when materials on electronic reserve are used again. **When requesting subsequent uses of materials, professors who intend to use electronic reserves (not books, pamphlets or other monographic publications) MUST PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION ON THE RESERVE REQUEST FORM FOR MATERIAL BEING PLACED ON ELECTRONIC RESERVE:**

Title of the publication
Publisher of the publication
Author/Editor of the article or book
Chapter/Article of the publication
Publication year
Page numbers (from and to)

This information is required well in advance of the date in which the reserve is needed by students to give the reserve department time to obtain permission. **Electronic reserves requiring copyright permission WILL NOT be placed on reserve until copyright permission has been granted.** If the electronic reserve will be used by the professor for only one class, one semester only, this information will not be required. If material needed to be placed on electronic reserve is contained in a book the library owns, the book will be placed on hard copy reserve instead.

ELECTRONIC RESERVE COPYRIGHT FEE LIMITS

Since the inception of electronic reserves at MSU in fall semester of 2001, Library Services has covered fees charged by the copyright holder for the use of protected material placed on electronic reserve. The current copyright fee limits are as follows:

- A limit of \$50 per single article per semester.
- A limit of \$200 per course per semester.
